## Discover a Watershed Educator Workshop & Floating Field Experience September 16 & 17, 2010

The two-day workshop will include training in Project WET, Leopold Education Project, and Discover a Watershed. During the course, participants will engage in hands on activities related to water and watersheds, natural resources, habitat and much more with a focus on local watershed resources and issues. Participants will learn what environmental education is and how to incorporate it into the classroom. On day 2, an optional canoe float trip with Friends of the Kaw (FOK) will include a variety of outdoor investigations and activities to engage your students in discovering their watersheds!

**Day 1** → in the classroom at Horton High School

**Day 2** → float trip on the Delaware River

Open to all educators working with K-12 students (teachers, scout leaders, camp counselors, etc.)

Registration Fee = \$30.00 (includes Workshop and Float Experience fees)
